The July Course

TurfTrax Sectional Times available for all 21 races at the Moët & Chandon July Festival

Newmarket Racecourses will be utilising the TurfTrax sectional timing and tracking system (STATS) for all 21 races at the Moët & Chandon July Festival.

Newmarket Racecourses has been a long-standing ambassador for using modern technology to analyse horse racing and has built up a substantial database of information for both The July Course and The Rowley Mile, meaning comparisons can be made between years.

The sectional times and speeds of the horses will be shown in 'real time' on Channel 4, Racing UK and on the July Course's Closed Circuit Television. The data will also be available on TurfTrax's website 20 minutes after the race and will be distributed to the media post-race.

Michael Prosser, Head of Racing, Jockey Club East Region, said:

"We are delighted to be using the technology once again at the Moët & Chandon July Festival. We know the equipment works well at Newmarket and we have a large database of information for various distances and ground conditions. This means that comparisons can be readily made between years which is particularly informative when assessing our Group 1 races at the Moët & Chandon July Festival, the Darley July Cup and QIPCO Falmouth Stakes."
